Keeping you in the loop...

- Thank you for your response to the letter I sent out regarding our **Mission Investment Fund Loan!** We really appreciate your generous support toward retiring this financial burden. The Finance Team has decided that any money received will be used to go toward the loan principal verses the monthly loan payment. That will ultimately lessen the time required to complete this commitment (which is a good thing).
